

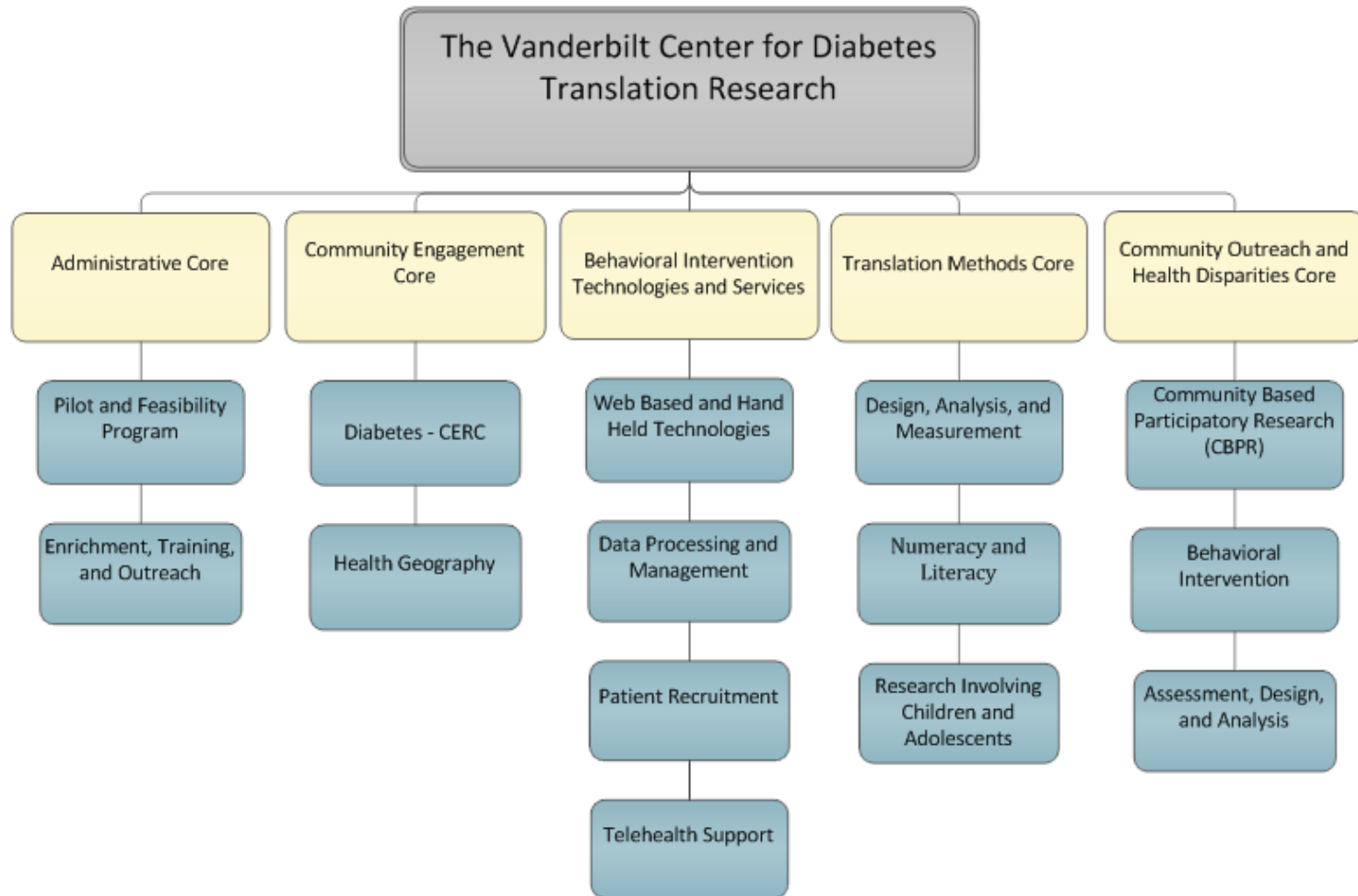
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The Vanderbilt Center for Diabetes Translation Research consists of Five Cores:
